Alcohol, gambling and tobacco commission discussion of 1/7/2009: Mark Healy, gambling manager, and Scott Carlson, representing Country Lanes North, were present on behalf of the application. Mr. Healy explained that Combined Charities of Minnesota consists of bowling alley proprietors who have formed a 501C3 corporation to facilitate raising money for charities. To the commission's question, Mr. Healy replied that they would like to put a pulltab machine in the two bowling alleys and would like to be open as soon as they get their permit from the state. He also stated that they have other pulltab locations in the state but these are their first sites in Duluth. To further questioning, Mr. Healy replied that he will have an assistant gambling manager to take care of the daily deposits and supply the machine. Mr. Carlson stated that the bowling alley employees will do the payout for any pulltab winners. In response to the commission's question, Ms. Lutterman replied that City Code requires organizations spend 65 percent of net profit be spent in Duluth or locally. There being no further discussion, Mr. Karki moved that THE PREMISE PERMIT APPLICATIONS OF COMBINED CHARITIES OF MINNESOTA BE APPROVED AND THE SAME BE RECOMMENDED TO THE CITY COUNCIL FOR APPROVAL. Mr. Pekkala seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.
