

LAKE SUPERIOR BREWING COMPANY, (RESPECT YOUR MOTHER EARTH), LEIF ERICKSON PARK, - APPLICATION FOR A TEMPORARY ON SALE INTOXICATING LIQUOR LICENSE FOR APRIL 30, 2011, WITH DON HOAG, MANAGER.

Don Hoag was present on behalf of the application. Mr. Hoag explained that they have been asked to sell beer again at an Earth Day event at Leif Erickson Park on April 30th. He continued saying that this is a family event that includes food, music and miscellaneous vendors, and they will start setting up at the event around 10:00 a.m. and go until approximately 9:00 p.m. Mr. Hoag explained that the event organizers will be putting up snow fencing along the perimeter of the area in the park so that there will be two entrance/exit points. To questioning from the commission, Mr. Hoag replied that the event sponsors are also hiring two off duty police officers to provide security during the event. The clerk stated that Officer Vang has approved this application. There being no further discussion, Mr. Donahue moved that THE APPLICATION OF LAKE SUPERIOR BREWING COMPANY, LLC, (EARTH DAY), LEIF ERICKSON PARK FOR A TEMPORARY ON SALE INTOXICATING LIQUOR LICENSE FOR APRIL 30, 2011, WITH DON HOAG, MANAGER, BE APPROVED, AND THE SAME BE RECOMMENDED TO THE CITY COUNCIL FOR APPROVAL. Mr. Birchland seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved.
