BE IT RESOLVED, that the city council of the city of Duluth makes the following findings of fact:


a) On April 6, 2011, the alcohol, gambling and tobacco commission held a public hearing to consider whether disciplinary action should be taken against the intoxicating liquor license of the Order of the Owl's, Nest #1200, (Owl's Club), 118 East Second Street, and has submitted its report to the city council of the city of Duluth as Public Document No. \_\_\_\_\_;

(b) Pursuant to Duluth City Code Chapter 8, Section 9, clause (a), on May 9, 2011, the city council considered the records and evidence submitted;

(c) The finding of facts as set forth in Public Document No. \_\_\_\_\_ regarding any suspension, revocation and/or civil penalty relating to the on sale consumption and display liquor license of the Order of the Owl's, Nest #1200, (Owl's Club), 118 East Second Street are adopted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the decision of the city council regarding any suspension, revocation and/or civil penalty is as follows: that the city council impose a \$500 civil penalty payable within 30 days of final council action, and that payment of \$250.00 of the penalty be stayed for a period of one year on the condition that the Licensee have no same or similar violations.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: The alcohol, gambling and tobacco commission (AGTC) held a hearing on April 6, 2011, regarding the bottle club license of the Owl's Club. On November 2, 2010, the police department conducted an alcohol compliance check at this location. The bartender was cited for selling alcohol to a minor (Section 8-35), and was also cited for selling alcohol to a non member of the Owl's Club (Section 8-43) both of which are a violation of city code. This is the first offense for the licensee, and Section 8-9 provides that the presumptive penalty for a first offense is a \$500 penalty. The recommendation of the AGTC is to impose a civil penalty of \$500 payable within 30 days of council action, and that payment of \$250.00 of the penalty be stayed for a period of one year on the condition that the Licensee have no same or similar violations.

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REPORT TO THE CITY COUNCIL

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**IN THE MATTER OF: ORDER OF OWLS, NEST 1200, d/b/a Owl's Club, 118 E. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Duluth, Minnesota 55805.**

The above-entitled matter came on for hearing before the Duluth Alcohol, Gambling and Tobacco Commission on April 6, 2011, in the City Council Chambers in Duluth, Minnesota. The hearing record closed on April 6, 2011, upon completion of the hearing.

Terri L. Lehr, Assistant City Attorney, City of Duluth, Office of the City Attorney, 410 City Hall, Duluth, Minnesota, 55802, appeared on behalf of the City licensing staff. Licensee appeared through its managing agent, Donald Brandt.

This Report is a recommendation, not a final decision. The Duluth City Council will make the final decision after a review of the record which may adopt, reject or modify the Findings of Fact, Conclusions and Recommendations contained herein. Pursuant to Minn.Stat. §14.61, the final decision of the Council shall not be made until this Report has been made available to the parties to the proceeding for at least ten days. An opportunity must be afforded to each party adversely affected by the Report to file exceptions and present argument to the City Council. Parties should contact the City Clerk to ascertain the procedure for filing exceptions or presenting argument.

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The commission makes the following findings of fact:

1. Licensee is licensed by the City of Duluth for "on-sale" Beer/Bottle Club at a premises located at 118 E. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Duluth, Minnesota.
2. On November 2, 2010, Allan J. Broskovetz, an employee of Licensee, sold and served intoxicating liquor to an underage person at Licensee's business establishment known as the Owl's Club. Broskovetz was cited for the violation and convicted on November 5, 2010.

3. Licensee was cited under Duluth City Code section 8-35 for the unlawful sale and convicted of this offense on December 30, 2010. Licensee was also cited under Duluth City Code section 8-43 for sale to a non-member of the club or member guest and convicted of this offense on November 22, 2010.
4. The Commission then issued its Notice of Hearing and set a hearing date of April 6, 2011.
5. Section 8-9(b)(1) of the Duluth Legislative Code provides that grounds for disciplinary action include the operation of the liquor establishment in violation of any law. Section 8-35 provides that every licensee shall be responsible for the conduct of the licensee's place of business and that any violation of Chapter 8 of the Duluth Legislative Code committed on the licensed premises by an employee of the licensee shall be deemed the act of the licensee as well as the employee.
6. The Commission finds the following mitigating circumstances: the Owl's Club has been operating for 107 years and does not have a history of any prior violations.

### **CONCLUSIONS**

Based upon these facts, the commission makes the following conclusions:

1. That the violations alleged in the Notice of Hearing occurred.
2. That the Licensee is liable for the violations occurring on its licensed premises on November 2, 2010.
3. Section 8-9(c) of the Duluth City Code provides that the presumptive penalty for a first offense is a \$500.00 civil penalty. However, mitigating circumstances exist as follows: the Owl's Club has been operating for 107 years and does not have a history of any prior violations.


## RECOMMENDATION

It is the recommendation of the Duluth Alcohol, Gambling and Tobacco Commission that the Duluth City Council impose the following civil penalty:

1. Payment of a \$500.00 penalty; and
2. That payment of \$250.00 of the penalty be stayed for a period of one year on the condition that the Licensee have no same or similar violations; and
3. That payment of \$250.00 of the penalty be made within 30 days of final council action.

**Alcohol, Gambling, and Tobacco Hearing**  
**April 6, 2011**  
**Order of Owls, Nest 1200, d/b/a Owl's Club, 118 East Second Street**

Oswald: The first hearing is for the Owl's Club at 118 East Second Street and Terri Lehr from the Attorney's office is here and Don Brandt from the Owl's Club.

Brandt: My name is Donny Brandt. I'm the manager of the Owl's Club.

Hanson: Okay. Counselor Lehr.

Lehr: Thank you, President Hanson. I think I can be very brief. I did speak with Mr. Brandt briefly today before the hearing started and his position is that is he is not challenging anything that we've set forth in the Notice of Hearing. So, he does acknowledge that an employee served a minor who was also a non-member of the Club and that ticket was paid and the Owl's Club also paid the ticket that they were issued. So, that's basically an admission by the Owl's Club that those violations did occur. I did explain to Mr. Brandt that the Police Department is recommending that this be treated as a single violation, as a first violation. So, the presumptive penalty is \$500.00 and that's the recommendation that we are making to this Commission in terms of a penalty. Mr. Brandt does want to be heard regarding what he thinks the penalty should be in this particular matter. So with that I would simply rest on the Notice of Hearing and the documents attached to it.

Hanson: All right. Thank you, Counselor Lehr.

Brandt: Okay. Like I said, I'm the Manager and I feel \$500.00 is a little unfair. We paid \$600.00 for it already. We are a private club. Normally we do not let anybody in our club unless they're members. But on Tuesday nights we have what they call Buck Burger Night. Well, we do have a family that comes in with a bunch of older adults....older kids. You know, 23, 24, 25, 26 at the time, the bartender thought that this kid that was at the bar was one of the patrons with the family and that there. Well, we found out he wasn't. So, we know we made a mistake there. We did pay the \$600.00 and that there and I think \$600.00 is fair enough. We're a private club. We're trying to make things go and everything else and another \$500.00 is just a lot of more money for us to dish out.

Hanson: Did he card the person?

Brandt: No. He didn't. See he thought he was with the group. We card all of our

members. Normally we card all our members but that Buck Burger Night, we're usually busy at the time and like I said, he thought he was with that family and he wasn't with the family.

Hanson: What actions....have you taken any actions to make sure that something like this doesn't happen again?

Brandt: Yes, sir. We have.

Hanson: Can you describe what those actions would be?

Brandt: Well, we have volunteer bartenders and anytime that a person that comes into the Clubs that we do not know, we ask....we tell them that we are a private club and if you're not a member, we can't serve you. You have to go.

Hanson: Any questions from the Board here?

Donahue: When's the last time you've ever had a violation?

Brandt: We never have. The Owls Club has been in existence for 107 years. We've been at our establishment since 1924. We're probably one of the oldest places. I think we are the only bottle club that I know of in St. Louis County, aren't we? Yeah. But we have never had a violation. Like I said, we're 107 years old and I've been a manager there for 13 years now. I was executive chef around town for many restaurants and that there and I know the law and everything else. The bartender, he really felt bad about it, you know. Being a private club, you know, that private clubs are having a hard time existing and that there.

Hanson: Well, we don't want to put you out of business but we also don't want you to serve minors.

Brandt: We guarantee we will not, sir.

Hanson: Do your volunteer bartenders take any classes or anything to

Brandt: We have a manual.

Hanson: You have a manual.

Brandt: Yeah.

Hanson: All right. Any further

Hanson: I'm looking for a motion. Mr. Hammack, you were first.

Hammack: Okay. I make a motion that we process the \$500.00 penalty and defer the \$250.00. Payable within 30 days of City Council approval.

Hanson: Any with no same or similar for one year.

Hammack: One year. If this is a serious thing or an occasion within one year, then the balance would be due on it.

Donahue: Now, when we do this here, just to make sure that I have this straight, do we have to give a mitigating circumstance?

Hanson: We need a second first.

Donahue: Okay. Second. Okay, I'll second.

Hanson: Now the motion has been seconded. So now, Mr. Donahue, we're gonna discuss.

Donahue: Yeah. I mean do we have to give a reason why now?

Lutterman: Yes. Commissioner Donahue.

Hanson: I can handle this one. Mitigating or aggravating circumstances are to be stated with any that it deviates from what it ways in the book.

Donahue: Okay.

Hanson: So, if you feel there's a mitigating circumstance then I kinda like to hear that along with the motion. So, if you're recommending \$250.00 deferred then that suggests that we feel there is a mitigating circumstance telling us that we....we need to tell the Council why we think it shouldn't be \$500.00 and that it should just be \$250.00 with \$250.00 deferred. That's the mitigating circumstance

Donahue: Right.

Hanson: I'm looking to hear from you guys.

Hammack: Because if we have to state that they've had a long record of success and this is their first major violation.

Hanson: 107 years. Okay.

Donahue: That's why I wanted to make sure

Hanson: So, will Commissioner Donahue second that as the mitigating circumstance as part of the motion, please?

Donahue: I'll second it.

Hanson: All right. Is there any further discussion?

Hanson: All right. So, all in favor of the motion say "Aye".

Opposed? The motion passes unanimously. Maybe we won't see you for another 107 years.

Brandt: At 75 years old? No.

Hanson: I'm guessing I might not be here either.

Brandt: Thank you very much.

Hanson: Do we need to encourage him to show up at the City Council meeting just in case? Okay. Mr. Brandt, just to be on the safe side, you should plan on showing up at that City Council meeting because they have the right to overrule whatever we say. They can deny our recommendations. So, you're gonna want to be there in case somebody decides to take it upon themselves to be heroic and pull our recommendation off the agenda and stick it to you. Okay?

Brandt: I'll do that.

Hanson: Thank you, sir.

Brandt: Thank you very much.

PLEASE BE ADVISED that on **April 6, 2011**, at 4:45 p.m. in the Council Chambers at City Hall in the City of Duluth, the Duluth Alcohol, Gambling and Tobacco Commission will hold a hearing, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes §340A.415 and Section 8-9 of the Duluth City Code, to consider what, if any, disciplinary action, including suspension or revocation or a civil fine of not to exceed \$2,000, will be recommended to the Duluth City Council with respect to your intoxicating liquor license.

If you do not appear at said hearing, the Alcohol, Gambling and Tobacco Commission may, in your absence, recommend that the Duluth City Council consider the allegations contained herein to be true.

At the above-mentioned hearing, you may, at your option, be represented by legal counsel.

The Rules for Contested Case Hearings Minnesota Rules Chapter 1400, Part 5550, et.seq, to the extent applicable, and Minnesota Statutes §14.57 through §14.69 govern. Copies of these laws and rules may be obtained at the Duluth Public Library or online from the official web site of the State of Minnesota.

The City will present its case, and then you will have an opportunity to present your case. At the time of the hearing, you should be prepared to produce any evidence and arguments you feel are relevant to the issues raised. You or your attorney will be allowed

to cross-examine all adverse witnesses. If needed, subpoenas are available (Minnesota Rules 1400.7000).

You must advise the Commission if you seek to admit evidence that is classified not public. If data that is not public is admitted, it may become public. Relief is available under Minnesota Statutes §14.60, subd. 2. If an interpreter is needed, you must inform the Commission and one will be appointed.

A notice of appearance must be filed with the City Clerk within 20 days of the date of service of the notice of hearing if you intend to appear at the hearing.

**The person representing the City, who you should contact to discuss settlement or other concerns is Terri L. Lehr, Assistant City Attorney.**

The hearing will be open to the public.

The following facts give rise to the inquiry and hearing mentioned above:

1. Licensee is licensed by the City of Duluth for "on-sale" Beer/Bottle Club at a premises located at 118 E. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Duluth, Minnesota.
2. On or about November 2, 2010, Allan J. Broskovetz sold and served intoxicating liquor to an underage person at Licensee's business establishment known as the Owl's Club. Broskovetz was cited for the violation and convicted on November 5, 2010. *See City Docs. No. 1-3 (Duluth Police Department Report ICR# 10-399204; City of Duluth Ordinance Violation Ticket No. LP10000251; and Proof of Payment of Ticket).*
3. Licensee was cited under Duluth City Code section 8-35 for the unlicensed sale and convicted of this offense on December 30, 2010. *See City Docs. No. 4-5 (City of Duluth Ordinance Violation Ticket No. LP10001757; and Proof of Payment of Ticket).* Licensee was also cited under Duluth City Code section 8-43 for sale to a non-member of the club or member guest and convicted of this offense on November 22, 2010. *See City Docs. No. 6-7 (City of Duluth Ordinance Violation No. LP10001758; and Proof of Payment of Ticket).*

4. Pursuant to City Code Sections 8-9(a) and (b)(1) the Alcohol, Tobacco and Gambling Commission will consider whether the violation alleged is good cause for suspension or revocation of the liquor license or for the imposition of a civil penalty.
5. This is the Licensee's first offense for purposes of the presumptive penalty schedule provided for in Duluth City Code section 8-9.
6. Pursuant to Duluth City Code section 8-9, absent aggravating or mitigating circumstances, the presumptive penalty for a first offense is a \$500.00 civil penalty.

**SYNOPSIS:**

This report involves the citing of ALLAN JOSEPH BROSKOVETZ, dob:05/05/43 for selling alcohol to a minor. BROSKOVETZ is a bartender at the Owl's Club.

**NARRATIVE:**

On 11/02/2010, I, Officer Stovern/327 was working alcohol compliance checks with Officer Rodman and 19 year old NICHOLAS EDWARD PRACHER, dob:02/28/90. At approximately 1815 hours we pulled up in front of the Owl's Club at 118 E. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street. PRACHER walked into the Owl's Club and sat at the bar and Officer Rodman and myself walked in shortly after. We stood in the entryway and kept a visual on PRACHER who was served a can of beer. We walked up to the bartender and he identified himself with a Minnesota photo ID as ALLAN JOSEPH BROSKOVETZ, dob:05/05/43. BROSKOVETZ admitted serving PRACHER saying that he was going to go back and talk to him more and ask him who he was and if he belonged to the Owl's Club.

BROSKOVETZ was issued a City ordinance violation for selling alcohol to a minor.
