
RESOLUTION ISSUING A TEMPORARY ON SALE 3.2 MALT LIQUOR
LICENSE TO NIFTY 50 CRUISERS CAR CLUB, (KIA OF DULUTH

Alcohol, Gambling and Tobacco Commission discussion: 7/6/11
Ryan Kern was present on behalf of the application. Mr. Kern explained that they
would like to be able to serve beer during the time trials being held in
September. He continued saying that they will be using snow fencing to section
off a parking lot on Garfield Avenue to create a beer garden and plan on serving
the beer from noon until approximately 6:00 p.m. depending on the time the event
is over. Mr. Kern further explained they would also like to include Sept. 10th
in their application, as they have permission to use private property to set up
a beer tent from 5:00 p.m. to midnight for the car drivers as they deliver their
cars for the race. To questioning from the commission, Mr. Kern replied that he
has been working with the police department and will be using off duty police
officers for security for the time trials and also for security in the beer
garden, and no one will be allowed outside the beer garden with their beer.
There being no further discussion, Mr. Birchland moved THAT THE APPLICATION OF
NIFTY 50 CRUISERS, (KIA OF DULUTH CAR SHOW AND TIME TRIALS), 350 GARFIELD AVENUE,
FOR A TEMPORARY ON SALE 3.2 PERCENT MALT LIQUOR LICENSE FOR SEPTEMBER 10 & 11,
2011, WITH RYAN KERN, MANAGER, BE APPROVED, AND THE SAME BE RECOMMENDED TO THE
CITY COUNCIL FOR APPROVAL. Mr. Hammack seconded the motion, and it was
unanimously approved.
