RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO CONSTRUCT PUBLIC SANITARY SEWER MAIN AND SERVICES ON LIVINGSTON AVENUE AND TO ASSESS A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF.

CITY PROPOSAL:


RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 61 of the City Charter, the council hereby expresses its intent to cause the following properties named below to be improved with public sanitary sewer and services as part of the city's 2012 Municipal State Aid project and hereby requests that the mayor prepare or cause to have prepared plans, specifications and estimates therefor, and file such plans and estimates with the special assessment board together with a recommendation as to what portion of the cost shall be paid by special assessment and what part, if any, shall be a general obligation of the city, the number of installments in which assessments may be paid, and the lands which should include the special assessments:

2315, 2319 and 2331 Livingston Avenue





STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: This resolution begins the formal process of making assessable improvements to the sanitary sewer system serving properties on Livingston Avenue to replace temporary private sanitary sewer services with a public sanitary sewer main, new services, and connecting the new services to the

new main. As provided for in Section 61 of the City Charter, the process can be commenced either by petition or by action of the city council itself. The latter route is being used in this case in the interest of time. There are already outstanding agreements that require the owners to join in a petition for the construction of a public sanitary sewer. The three properties involved have never paid for sanitary sewer service.


This resolution of intent is the first step in the process. Notices will then be sent to the affected property owners, and they will be given the opportunity to be heard before the special assessment board. After the board makes its recommendations, the matter will return to the city council for consideration of an ordering-in resolution.





EXISTING PRIVATE SEWER SERVICES
