




RESOLUTION ISSUING A TEMPORARY ON SALE 3.2 MALT LIQUOR
LICENSE TO TWIN PORTS MIRACLE LEAGUE, WHEELER FIELD.

CITY PROPOSAL:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the city council of the city of Duluth hereby issues the following temporary on sale 3.2 percent malt liquor licenses, subject to departmental approvals:

Twin Ports Miracle League, (Minnesota State Police and Fire Softball Tournament), Wheeler Field, for July 28-29, 2012, with Matt McShane, manager.

Alcohol, gambling, and tobacco commission discussion of 5/2/2012: Matt McShane was present on behalf of the application. Officer McShane explained that they are sponsoring the annual softball tournament at Wheeler Field for the State Police and Fire Department tournament and would like to be able to sell beer. To the board's questioning, Officer McShane replied that they will sell the beer out of the concession stand and will have uniformed officers as security for the tournament. Assistant City Attorney Lutterman explained that in order to obtain a temporary beer license, the applicant needs to be a nonprofit corporation, an association, or a fraternal/religious organization, and this applicant does not qualify for the license. Officer McShane stated he was just made aware of this, and will have a non profit organization apply for this license. Ms. Lutterman stated the commission could approve this application on the condition that a State registered non profit organization apply for this license. There being no further discussion, Mr. Birchland moved THAT THE APPLICATION OF DULUTH POLICE SOFTBALL TEAM, WHEELER FIELD, FOR A TEMPORARY ON SALE 3.2 PERCENT MALT LIQUOR LICENSE, FOR JULY 28-29, 2012, WITH MATT MCSHANE, MANAGER, BE APPROVED, WITH THE CONDITION THE NEW APPLICANT IS A REGISTERED NON PROFIT ORGANIZATION WITH THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, AND THE SAME BE RECOMMENDED TO THE CITY COUNCIL FOR APPROVAL. Mr. Stauber seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved.
