CITY PROPOSAL:







STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: This resolution authorizes acceptance of a grant in the amount of up to \$22,391.77 from the city of Minneapolis to reimburse Duluth for the costs of having four members of its Chemical Assessment Team participate in Hazardous Materials Transportation Specialist training to be held in College Station, Texas. The City of Minneapolis is the primary recipient of a federal grant under which they are authorized to fund participation in the training by other CAT teams. Duluth has been offered a grant to cover all of its costs of participating in the training.
