DULUTH PUBLIC LIBRARY BOARD Minutes of Regular Meeting October 23, 2018

Call to Order: President Rosendahl called the meeting of the Duluth Library Board to order at 4:31 p.m. on Tuesday, October 23, 2018.

Old Business:

Advocacy update

- The Duluth News Tribune published a story about the Board's resolution last meeting on Saturday, October 20. Remarks to the press were made by board vice president Sperl. Rosedahl has received feedback from city councilors. When the resolution was sent via email to the city council, it was also immediately sent to the media because it was sent to councilors as a group rather than individually.
- Ramsland stated that members of Friends of the Library are continuing advocacy letters to the city council. The Foundation has not met since the GALA so no advocacy updates have been made.
- On Tuesday, November 13 from 5:45 to 6 p.m. Powers will present the 2019 library budget request to the City Council. There is no public comment at this presentation. All budgets will be finalized by the end of the year. Time for public comment would be in December when the budget is acted upon by the city council. Powers will notify the board when the time has been identified. Library supporters may choose to advocate on behalf of the library at that time.
- No new advocacy action will be made this month, as last month's resolution was sent only two weeks ago. Following the November board meeting, a letter will be crafted by the board to follow up with resolution sent last month.
- Erik Birkeland, Duluth's property and facilities manager, will be asked to report to the library board with information on costs for maintaining building, to keep the current building safe and functional.

Library Board vacancy

 One vacancy remains. No further applications have been submitted since the last board meeting. The city council will be asked to make an announcement at a meeting regarding this position. Signs for the vacancy and how to apply will be posted at all library branches. Members of the public are encouraged to apply.

New Business:

Library Usage Statistics

- Monthly data charts for each location on usage were provided for 2017 and the months completed for 2018.
- A decrease in usage of the main library is noted since Superior Street construction began. Mount Royal branch has seen a boost during these months. West Duluth has shown stable usage.
- The level of library programming has expanded over the years. Programming ideas are generated by library staff as well as community members who pitch program ideas. Powers stated that the library staff are trying to figure out how to balance programming with the current staff availability.
- There are no current state benchmarks for usage and programming. The national Public Libraries Association (PLA) will be referenced to look for comparisons with other libraries the size of DPL. In 2009, there was no programming for adults, however 130 programs have been offered so far in 2018. All of these programs have had community attendance.

"We're Thankful for You" fine-free initiate for November 2018

The Arrowhead Library Systems (ALS) has proposed that during the month of November, overdue fees and replacement card fee fines be waived for youth. Fines and fees can be a barrier for patrons' use of library resources. This initiative aligns well with the Port Card program for a fresh start to encourage youth to use the library. The patron would need to come to the library, outstanding fines would be forgiven, and a new card would be given without cost. Actual cost of lost or damaged materials would still be due. This would only be for youth. Motion to participate in the ALS initiative passed unanimously.

Friends of the Library Report

From meeting of November 20, 2018

Questions and discussion on Give to the Max and the donation button on the Friends website. Treasurer gave library a check for \$20,000, plus another check for \$445, which represented donations and memorials. Approximately \$15,000 still remains after above distribution. 743 copies of the newsletter mailed by UDAC. Total cost is \$222 for labels and mailing by UDAC, and \$222 for copies by Paper Hog. Newsletter goes out 4 times a year. Future discussions needed on whether to go paperless and save money. Open house at DPL scheduled for sometime in December to celebrate re-opening of Superior Street. No angle parking in front of building. Four 5-minute drop off parking spots will be designated. 8,765 virtual library cards given to students of ISD 709. Requested by a Friends board member and noted that all Duluth children should be included in the program; Carla said the next phase will do that. Foundation reported that Learning & Libations will continue with more involvement by volunteers. Endowment at close to \$1.5 million; 4% of value will go to DPL. Advocacy discussed: possible Friends' letter to mayor and individual counselors on library's Port Card program. At least 5 minutes at each board meeting will be spent on advocacy ideas. Board member Lee Malis will check with Zenith News on getting Friends a free ad. No meeting in December.

Manager's Report to Library Board November 2018

Superior Street Construction Update. New benches, bike loops and planters were installed early this month, and our section of the street opened on November 15. There is parallel parking in front of the building, and a payment kiosk will be installed soon. We have requested that four of the spots be designated as five-minute drop-off zones for people returning books and picking up holds. Staff is organizing an open house in early December to celebrate the end of road construction and welcome people back to the library.

Port Card Project. This project went live on November 7. A total of 8765 Port Cards were created using records from ISD 709. In the first 10 days of the project we've had 68 checkouts using the Port Card (49 at Main, 11 at Mt. Royal and 8 at West). Students have checked out a total of 119 items on Port Cards. Soon teachers will be able to sign up for educator cards in order to make it easier for them to make use of our online resources in the classroom.

Racial Equity Workshop. Earlier this month two staff members and I attended a workshop on racial equity organized by the Minnesota Department of Education. The workshop was designed to call attention to structural and institutional racism, and to highlight the role of public libraries to advance racial equity. My biggest takeaway was that we need to examine our policies and procedures through the lens of equity, paying special attention to how they may create barriers to library access.

Staff Vacancies. Two library staff members recently turned in their resignation. Librarian II Alicia Peterson, who coordinates work and programs at the branches, and Library Supervisor Richmond Kinney, who oversees Adult and Technical Services, both will be leaving DPL. I expect to get approval to fill the positions, but the approval process is still underway at this writing.

Joining ALS Consortium. After much discussion we have decided to formally put on hold the idea of joining the Arrowhead Library System's shared computer consortium for three more years. While the project has a lot of potential in terms of resource sharing and cost savings, concerns about the Horizon software and differences in cataloging practices have convinced us that it's best to take a pause, clear the way for ALS staff to focus on bringing on a few more schools, and revisit it again in the future.

Envisionware. A project to replace the library's PC management software and begin accepting credit cards is proceeding. A contract with a company called Envisionware will be submitted to the City Council for approval on December 10. We expect to have the software installed and operational in early 2019. Accepting credit cards and providing a more automated way of paying for computer printouts are important steps in our move to provide a supported self-service model of operations. The goal is to free up more staff time to devote to early literacy efforts and library programming.
