Public Hearings

PL 23-025 Historic Construction/Demolition Permit for Roof Repairs at the Carnegie Building at 101 W 2^{nd} Street by Michael Clevette

Staff: Tom Church noted item before the commission the and introduced the speaker. **Applicant:** Architect Robert Fern addressed he commission on behalf of the applicant/Michael Clevette. The building's existing clay tile roof system has failed and is beyond repair. This roof has severe leaks which are deteriorating the building's structural system as well as interior finishes. Something has to be done now to prevent further deterioration. He noted some of the clay tiles are salvageable.

Commissioners: McCullough asked if the clay tiles are original. Fern affirmed, and noted they are able to source out a similar tile. Ken Buehler asked what the construction time frame is. Per Fern, the hope to start as soon as possible on a temporary fix. They are hoping to have their funding secured by 2024 for a permanent fix. Kal Randa asked where the original tiles are being kept. Fern noted the are being held in a safe location on site.

PL 23-015 Historic Construction/Demolition Permit for exterior improvements to the Board of Trade Building at 301-307 W 1st Street by James Freeman/Three D I, LLC **Staff:** Tom Church gave an overview and noted the building is not a local landmark, but is within the historic district. They do not require HPC approval but welcome comments.

Commissioners: Randa noted the interior carving inside the front doorway. Will they be preserved? Church will follow up with the owner and report back to the commissioners. Jessica Glander noted this has been an ongoing project.

4901 Grand Ave – AT&T adding cell towers – 106 Process – Inviting comments. **Staff:** Tom Church gave an overview. The applicant is inviting comments within the next 30 days.

Commissioners: The commissioners agreed it will not effect anything historic. Chair Glander noted there is already an existing tower at this location and the change will be minimal.

Local Landmark Discussion

Commissioners: Gary Eckenberg asked what the process is for receiving local landmark status. Chair Glander noted there are forms online which ask for the history and background of nominated subject. The owner of the property needs to give their consent. A preservation plan needs to follow. The nominated item could be landscaping (i.e. zoo) or buildings. The status gives the HPC teeth to help preserve it, and could allow the owner to receive historic tax credits if they come back to Minnesota. The status then goes to the planning commission and the city council for approval.
